Elk Grove Township Food Pantry works hard to ensure that local residents in need of food are getting assistance. Through the generosity of our community, donations are up, but unfortunately, so is our usage. This means that we sometimes run out of essential items and must purchase them. Meijer has generously offered to assist us, but we need your help!



Here's how the program works:



From July 1st through September 24th each Meijer store partners with a local food pantry during campaigns to ensure that all donations generated remain within local communities.

Clerk's Corner

As you may have read, the Township Board is considering consolidating the various township facilities into one new location. Currently, Elk Grove Township has three facilities – the Township Hall and Highway Department Garage in Arlington Heights, the Township Youth Services Building in Mount Prospect and the Township Daycare Center in Elk Grove Village. The impetus for considering a consolidation of these three facilities is multi-faceted and includes 1) A recent determination that the Township Hall is in need of major repairs and upgrades; 2) An indication of interest in the purchase of the Mount Prospect property as part of a major commercial redevelopment project; and 3) An ongoing plan to downsize and potentially outsourcing of Township Road & Bridge functions. All of these reasons are rooted in a deep commitment by the Township Supervisors and Trustees to ensure that Township residents/taxpayers are always provided the best service at the lowest cost.

Residents Have Final Say on Sale of Township Property. While the Township Board is in the early stages of the consolidation discussions and no decisions have been made, I think it is important to note that any final decision to sell Township property requires the approval of the Township electors. An elector is any person who has been registered to vote in the Township for 28 days or more. If the Board decides to sell any Township facility/property a Special Town Meeting will be called at which time the electors must adopt a resolution stating the intent to sell the property, describing the property in full, and stating the terms and conditions the electors deem necessary for the sale. The value of the property must be determined by a State licensed real estate appraiser and the appraisal must be available for inspection.

If the resolution for sale is approved by the electors, I will publish the resolution in a Township newspaper and post it at the Township Hall. Along with the resolution, I will include information about the date by which bids must be received and the time, place and date of the Regular Board Meeting at which the bids will be opened. When the bids are opened at the designated Regular Board Meeting, the Board may accept any bid it deems to be in the best interests of the Township. However, approval must be by a three-fourths vote and the bid must not be 80% less than the appraised value. The Board may also reject all bids and then the process has to begin all over again.

The bottom line is that you, the Township resident, have the final say regarding any sale (or purchase) of Township property. The Township Supervisor and Trustees will do their best to provide you with recommendations that they believe will best serve your interests in the most cost effective manner but, in the end, the decision will be yours.

Register Now for the November Election. An important Presidential election will take place this fall and since this is the last newsletter you will receive before election day, I want to remind you of how you can register to vote. Remember to be eligible to vote you must be a U.S. citizen, be at least 18 years of age, and be registered. There are three manners in which you can register to vote:

- 1) Visit the Cook County Clerk website at <http://cookcountyclerk.com/elections/register tovot e> and follow the instructions to register in one of three ways:
 - Online: If you have a valid Illinois driver's license or State ID, you may register to vote online by clicking on the "Elections-Suburban Cook County" tab at the top of the page and select "Register to Vote" through the Illinois State Board of Elections website.
 - PDF: If you don't have a valid driver's license or State ID, you can fill out a form online, print, sign and mail it in.
 - Paper: You can download a mail-in voter registration card. The cards are in multiple languages.
- 2) In person with a certified registrar:
 - At one of the Cook County Clerk's six locations. Go to http://cookcountyclerk.com/aboutus/hour_locations
 - At a municipal or Township Clerk Office
 - At an Illinois Secretary of State driver's license facility
- 3) In addition to these "regular" core registration procedures there is one special program for eligible residents who miss the 30 day window to register. Under the Grace Period Registration and Voting Program eligible residents can register at select locations in the area through the day before the election. You must have two forms of valid identification and you must vote at the same time that you register. The locations for this program will be found on the Cook County Clerk Website a month or so before the election, <http://cookcountyclerk.com/elections/register tovot e>

Assessing the Situation

My staff and I hope you and yours are enjoying a wonderful summer. We also want to thank you for your unfailing courtesy during the time that we were open for appeals to the Cook County Assessor.



When you receive the response to your appeal you will have two options. The first is to promptly request a re-review following the directions on the decision. The second is to appeal to the Cook County Board of Review. We do not have the date that Elk Grove Township will be open, but if you are on our email list you will be notified by our office. We are anticipating this will occur in September or October.

You are encouraged to call and give us your email address so that we can keep you informed of where we are in the tax cycle.

You should have paid your second installment tax bill by August 1st. Keep in mind that whatever change occurred due to the triennial reassessment in your assessed value, including the appeal process, will not be reflected on your property tax bill until the second installment due in 2017.

Storm Water Management - How You Can Help

(excerpt from MWRD Storm Water Management for Cook County Brochure available at the Township Office)

Storm water management does not merely apply to flood control. It can also be used to improve water quality and conserve potable water. You can help out by implementing Best Management Practices (BMPs) at your residence. Example BMPs include rain barrels, cisterns, green roofs, rain gardens, permeable paving and natural landscaping. One simple measure would be to disconnect your downspouts from the public storm sewer system. The storm water could be stored in rain barrels to be used to water gardens or directly discharged to rain gardens instead of flowing into our sewers. Reduction of storm water flow into our sewers reduces the amount of flow discharged into our waterways and can help to alleviate flood damages from occurring due to overbank flooding.

It is illegal to dump paint, oil, or any hazardous material into a street inlet as these materials will also pollute the waterway to which the storm sewer eventually discharges. Residents living near waterways should take extra care to remove debris on their property which could wind up in the waterway. Yard waste should be properly disposed of and not dumped into or along the banks of creeks or streams. Branches, bushes and other debris cause blockages at culverts and bridges which can cause flood damages for you and your neighbors.

If you see anyone dumping garbage or any debris into a waterway, please call the MWRD at 1-800-332-DUMP.

Bike Safety Recap and Thank You

As we go into summer we look back at the 2015/2016 school year as another great year in which we again instructed over 3,000 children in grades Kindergarten-5th grade in the subject of Bike Safety. We also sponsored a bike helmet sale during the spring break. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration a bike helmet reduces the risk of head injury by as much as 85 percent and the risk of brain injury by as much as 88 percent. More children age 5 to 14 go to hospital emergency rooms for injuries associated with bicycles than with any other sport.**

Elk Grove Township Bike Safety also had a very generous donation from the PacificCycle (Schwinn) Company, of 15 new Schwinn bicycles and 30 sets of training wheels! The students, as well as the teachers and Bike Safety employees were extremely excited to see the much needed, brand new bikes! We look forward to another great year, keeping all the children in our township safe while bike riding!

A Note from Youth Services

Monitoring Your Children's Social Media

Tips from the Parenting Toolbox



Kids these days seem tethered to some kind of electronic device (computer, tablet, cell-phone, all of the above), and there are many benefits for this rapidly growing

phenomenon. Notably, kids can communicate with their parents when away from the home, and can communicate with each other (which really is important for their development). But, as is often the case, there are also many negatives that come from the communication pipeline, particularly through social media. These include exposure to cyber-bullying (a huge problem), social rejection, sexting and exposure to other inappropriate content. So, given that social media is "here to stay," what can parents do to best ensure that it is used safely and appropriately by their children?

The following are some helpful tips:

- 1) **No underage Facebooking.** You have to be 13 to join, but it is up to parents to make sure their kids do not set up an account merely by giving a false birthdate.
- 2) **Check Privacy Settings** (often!), usually just find these in the "options" tab of your web browser, or "Privacy Settings" on Facebook (if you deem it OK for them to have an account).
- 3) **Use Filtering Software.** Programs such as Net Nanny and PureSight PC can be purchased, and you can monitor all online and computer activity. To monitor your child's cell phone, consider a program such as My Mobile Watchdog.
- 4) **Create Ground Rules.** As with countless other behaviors, parents need to set rules for computer (and phone) use, and enforce these with consequences. Without limits, many children will play computer games (or video games) all day long, or simply use social media well into the night. We have heard many parents complain that grades are dropping because of unlimited phone or computer use, but they have not dared to set limits on it. Kids will generally say things like, "my friends get to play til 10 at night." Say, "good for them!" Some parents successfully limit internet use (of all kinds) to an hour (or two) per day. Some parents even say, "weekends only." Have a discussion with your child, offer some give and take, and have them "earn" computer/phone time based upon performance with homework and other expectations. It really is OK to say, "hand me the phone every night at 8."
- 5) **Get to know what your children are up to.** Now that you have the tools and permission to monitor them, find out "what sites they go to," "what people they associate with (are there internet only friends; could this be an adult masquerading as a child?)." Or, "who are their Facebook friends, and what are their posts?" Yes, you have the right to have full access to their Facebook Account.
- 6) **Teach your child to be wary** of pop-up ads, free giveaways, and surveys. They are used to get personal information.
- 7) **Monitor the pictures** your child posts online. These can end up anywhere, and if they have any identifying information, this could be a problem.
- 8) **Teach your kids** about internet safety, and their own online reputation.

Post 9/11 Veterans' Group

Special Bus Trips for Seniors

The Elk Grove Township Transportation department offers door-to-door service to senior citizens (over 55) and disabled residents (over 18). Unpaid Tolls? Get I-PASS and Get Going!

Beginning July 5, 2016, cashless tolling will be coming to the Illinois Route 390 Tollway from Lake Street to I-290. Since there are no toll booths or automatic coin machines on the Illinois Route 390 Tollway, all customers are driving on an I-PASS Tollway. Drivers with unpaid tolls should make note of the toll collection location by identifying the toll plaza name, number or the nearest milepost and go online or pay by mail within the 7-day grace period.

Extended Grace Period for July

For the month of July, drivers with unpaid tolls will have an extended grace period to pay until **July 31, 2016**. After this date, the 7-day grace period will resume.

To avoid unpaid tolls, the easiest and cheapest way to travel along Illinois Route 390 is with an I-PASS. I-PASS transponders can be purchased in person, online, by phone or by mail. Nearly 200 Jewel-Osco locations* in Illinois sell I-PASS transponders including:


